"211" is an easy-to-remember, 3-digit toll-free telephone number that connects callers, in the language of their choice, to the non-emergency social, health, and government services and programs that serve their community.

This free, confidential, service links callers with high-skilled, multilingual in-

formation and referral specialists who are trained to direct them to the most appropriate service provider.

211 service is planned for Renfrew County by the year 2011 Official Launch February 28, 2011

The lead agency for the introduction of 211 service in Renfrew County is Renfrew County United Way (RCUW). The data base that will support 211 in Renfrew will be a version of County Connections, a directory of human services funded in part by RCUW. RCUW is funding the Community Resource Centre (Killaloe) Inc. to ensure that this data base is formatted to province-wide standards by the time of the official launch. Funding contributions from the province are in place, and discussions are underway for contributions from federal and municipal levels of government.

In 2006, United Way organizations across Ontario banded together to collectively call upon the Government of Ontario to "make 211 accessible to all residents of Ontario". The Government responded by providing a \$3 million grant over three years to expand and develop www.211Ontario.ca, a bilingual website housing a directory of approximately 60,000 human services available in Ontario. It also earmarked \$1.4 million to draw up a province-wide delivery model and to fund the acquisition of equipment for regional call centres. Today, nearly 50 percent of Ontario communities are connected to this service.
